Tournament Season

Our Club has always been regarded as an important tournament venue in South Africa. For the past 130 years, Royal has played an integral role in the development of amateur and professional golf in our country. We are proud to be at the forefront once again, following the success of the 2021 SA Amateur Championships held from 14-19 February 2021. For the second consecutive year, the Men's and Ladies SA Amateur championships were played simultaneously across both of our wonderful courses. A special thanks to our course manager, Shaun Brits and his team, for delivering exceptional playing conditions, considering they only had 4 days in which to complete two weeks' worth of preparations, due to all the rain.

As communicated, the Club's next and final external tournament for the year is the Sunshine Tour's Kit Kat Group Pro Am event, taking place on the East Course from 4-8 March 2021. We are proud to have this event televised live on SuperSport over the Saturday and Sunday, offering a great opportunity to once again showcase the abundance of our championship course.

Hosting these events so close to one another has certainly not been ideal and it has been an inconvenience to the golfing membership. In this regard we sincerely appreciate the members understanding and support and we hope you have/will enjoy the facilities and hospitality of the reciprocal courses on offer over this period. The golf management team are on standby to assist with reservations and we remind all members with unlimited playing tickets, that they will be refunded by the Club.

Your management team now start with membership renewal and budget preparations for the 2021/22 financial year, ahead of our first Board meeting of the year. We also take the opportunity to remind members that the annual member survey will be distributed in March/April and your participation in this exercise is greatly appreciated and of significant value to the Club's strategic planning.

Over the past couple of weeks, management have received an array of various questions from members and we would like to share the answers with the entire membership. We have therefore created a page called "recently asked questions" contained in the newsletter.

In closing, the positive demand for golf is ongoing. The Club continues to welcome a vast amount of new members and our staff are delivering on both safety prescripts and operational tasks. The financial assumptions remain on track to break-even for the financial year (regulations dependent) and in this regard, we are pleased to announce the re instatement of member's food & beverage discount (Clubcard 5%). Additionally, we will be reducing the Covid -19 responsibility fee from R30 – R20 per round (*note R10 continues to be allocated to the caddy subsidy fund & R10 towards PPE and consumables). This will take effect from Tuesday, 2 March 2021.

We are all tired of following guidelines, wearing masks, not hugging and having to sanitize our hands. However, we cannot drop our guard just yet and we remind all members to please continue being safe and follow all the risk mitigation guidelines.

COVID -19 Responsibility fee reduces to R 20









There is no doubt that the summer of 2020/21 has been the wettest summer that I have experienced here, but in chatting to some of our staff members who have been here for over twenty years, they have gone so far as reporting it as the wettest summer they have potentially experienced since 2000. We have recorded over 700mm of rain from September 2020 to the end of January 2021 and the period between the 25th of January up until the 8th of February

saw us experience another two weeks of soft, soaking rain when we recorded 130mm just before our tournament.

Whenever asked what the biggest threat to turf grass health is, the last answer one would opt for is water, but the reality of it is that too much water is in fact the biggest killer of turf grass. I often use the analogy of drowning because turf can most definitely drown when receiving too much water or alternatively rot in standing water. The obvious challenge with this much rain is that the water table becomes high quickly and ultimately the surface becomes so saturated that the water has nowhere to go, making a simple, daily task such as mowing seem quite challenging and at times impossible during these periods.





Often the decision to mow, as simple as it may seem, can become quite tricky for green keeping staff as we certainly do not want to risk the condition of our fairways by damaging them with mowers. The roughs particularly tend to soak up the most moisture and machines sink into heavily saturated clay. In the last few weeks, players would have seen our staff "squeeging" and raking up mud from our fairways following the mowing, in an attempt to save the kikuyu from rotting and drowning in this muddy clay and water.

As a result, the playability of the courses has naturally played softer and longer as the kikuyu soaks up every drop and green speeds drop due to all the moisture.

If you have played the courses recently you would have noticed that even with extra attention to raking and squeeging, we had incurred some minor damage on low lying and saturated fairways due to all the mud. Luckily, a week before the SA Amateur event, we were blessed with some sunshine and warmer weather which allowed the course team to repair some of these damages and prepare the courses as best we could in trying conditions. Hats off to my team for a task well done in a short period of time and although the courses presented well and ended up playing tough, it was apparently not tough enough for the fearless amateurs!

Onto the next event and as we approach our first professional tournament on the East during the first week of March, the team still have some hard work to do following the SA amateur championship and in preparations ahead of March. Whilst the sunshine seemed too good to be true, some rain is imminent once again and we will no doubt have some water issues to contend with.

We remind members that due to the seasonal rains along with the tournament of late, the turf is much longer than usual at this time of year and the team are doing their utmost to perform emergency drainage, sodding, target hollow tining and verti-cutting when possible. We are also mowing the roughs as much as is possible, weather permitting and without compromising our equipment or the condition of our facility.

Alongside these practices, we are also hand-weeding the goose grass that is once again prevalent on our tees and on our mowed walkways. Although unsightly, we assure members this is an issue we are addressing and it is seemingly coming in through our divot mix and also in highly compacted areas, which we are attending to.

We encourage all members to please ensure that they repair pitch marks more diligently during the wet periods and assist us in keeping the greens in great condition. We also thank members for their understanding and patience during an extremely wet season and the challenges we have faced.

This includes our own RJKGC members Josh de Aguiar, Mandla Dlamini, Jules Helary, Reece McKain, Sean Paxton and Heinrich Prinsloo in the men's championship with Josh, Reece and Mandla making it through to the match play round with Josh progressing to the 2nd round. RJKGC was also very well represented in the ladies championship – a report of the ladies success can be found in Wendy's column. Congratulations to everyone who participated!

With Club Championships around the corner, I do have to tell you this story of one of our members, who shall remain anonymous. He sent Jayde Rademeyer a WhatsApp message asking if he could get a tee time in the morning of the 6th of March as he has to attend a wedding in the afternoon, a minute goes by and he receives a reply back....

Hey, you're more than welcome to, but you will be playing alone (smiley faces)



The member replies back that they will be the first member to shoot 64 gross on the East. (More smiley faces)

He was the asked if he had any plans for 13th of March. His reply was – no I am clear on that day.

By this time, I think the whole golf department is in on the joke. A message was sent back to the bewildered member ... Well maybe you would like to play in our annual Cub Champs like the rest of the members.

I believe that the member in question is practicing on downing his "snake" that he will be getting soon...

I've taken some really neat information from John Cockayne's letter he wrote for the Business of golf site —" Professional Golfer since 1977 and is a fully qualified founder member and Life Member of the PGA of South Africa. He is a former Head Professional at Royal Oak, State Mines, Benoni Country Club and Southbroom Golf Club.

"My favourite of these however is a nice two-part trick question (with answers), you could win you a few rounds at the 19th! The first question is which Major is still on the current schedule, although its original format has been discontinued? The answer of course is the US PGA Championship, which started out life as a match play event, before switching its scoring format to stroke play in 1957.

The next question is who, according the context we have established with the previous examples, is the longest holder of any Major championship title? The answer is Lionel Herbert, who won the last version of US PGA in its match play format in 1957. Herbert won the Wannamaker trophy for his efforts, but although he had to return it in 1958 for its presentation to Dow Finsterwald, as the first winner of the event in its new stroke play format, Herbert has now held the match play version of the title for 63 years and counting!

Two other curious pieces of trivia involve the USPGA. The first is that no player has won the USPGA in both its formats. That said, Sam Snead, the winner in 1942, 1949 and 1951, made a real fist of it with podium finishes on three occasions in 1958, 1960 and incredibly in 1974 aged 52.

The second is that as if not to be outdone by the players, the Wannamaker trophy has also had an interesting history. Walter Hagen enjoyed a hitherto unmatched run in the USPGA by winning the title four years in a row from 1924 to 1927. In 1926, he did not take the trophy to the tournament and, as the consummate showman, his justification was that he did not intend to surrender it. Hagen went on to win the event for the third time in a row!


However, the same trick misfired in 1928, when Hagen again arrived at the Championship without the trophy, only to be beaten in the quarterfinals. His excuse this time around was that he had 'lost' the trophy! It eventually reappeared in 1930 in a box in a storage area at the company, which made Hagen's golf clubs. A substitute trophy had been made and when the original was recovered, it was 'retired' and is still on display at the PGA's historical centre in Florida.

Still on the subject of 'runs', Ben Hogan won the three Majors he played in 1953. The USPGA Championship features as the missing link for Hogan, as it was scheduled on dates, which overlapped with the Open Championship. Therefore, Hogan had to choose to miss one of the year's Majors and reportedly chose the USPGA, as its match play format, especially in the early rounds, required players to walk up to 36 holes a day. This physical demand was a bridge too far for Hogan, after his near crippling car accident in 1949, following which his doctor doubted that Hogan would ever walk again, let alone play golf.

Tiger Woods famously won all four of the Majors in a row from his dominating win at the US Open in 2000, to his taking the Masters title in 2001. Outside of this unique feat, Woods' streak in consecutive Majors from the 1999 USPGA is remarkable and reads – 1st, 5th, 1st, 1st, 1st, culminating in an anti-climactic 12th at the 2001 version of the US Open.

With Tiger being admitted to hospital at the time of writing this newsletter I am sure all the members of RJKGC wish him a speedy recovery.

In closing I would like to wish all the members the best of luck for the upcoming 2021 Club Championships, especially the poor member who has a "snake down down" coming....



SWING THOUGHTS

Choking

In my line of work it is amazing how often you hear the word choker. So too it came to pass that quite a few a years ago the unfortunate moniker was attached to a young Northern Irishman after he had a blow-out in a tournament. Oh all-right it wasn't just a blow-out it was a down-right disaster (63-80) and it wasn't just any old tournament, Rory McIlroy crash-banged and walloped at The Open at St. Andrews.

Although at the time I couldn't help but think, were the comparisons between him and Palmer, and some of his famous chokes and Greg Norman and his failings under pressure not somewhat premature? Here was a youngster that at age 22 had already won on the European tour and had done what few of his contemporaries (Anthony Kim, Ricky Fowler etc.) had done and that was challenge for a major. So I was prepared to call the dogs off from calling him a choker for a while yet.

However I wasn't given a free ride by my colleagues and clients when McIlroy famously choked again at Augusta, this time even more famously with a drive similar to that of Tiger in 1997 on the 18th. Pity this was the 10th because although Tiger found a nice patch of grass Rory found nothing but bush.....Just like I found nothing but abuse on Monday morning in my inbox!

Comments like: "you know nothing about the mind" and "you said this time he wouldn't choke again" rang in my ears. The press also had a field day and the word choker was thrown around with reckless abandon when the name McIlroy was mentioned.

In this month's RJK Swing Thoughts we discuss Rory McIlroy's amazing "move" from "choker" to major winner and why he has been able to overcome his early disappointments.

I am what I am

I use the words "choker" and "move" sarcastically as I believe that McIlroy never saw himself as a choker. I also firmly believe he never had to move away from being one. As the words to the famous song go it is up to each individual to define themselves as they see fit.

I also have a hunch that Arnold Palmer never saw himself as a choker but that Greg Norman after some of his disappointments did start to see himself as such. Although Rory did have some serious disappointments in those formative year, one never got the sense that he ever saw himself as a choker. That was something for the media to debate and not something that he bought into.

This has a serious implication for our expectations when we play in tournaments and even club competitions. The best in the world know that just by teeing it up in competition they not only bring possible success into the equation but also possible failure.

The odds in golf are also such that you will fail more often than you succeed. So if failing more often than you succeed makes you a choker then every golfer who has played the game is a choker. Choking often has more to do with your inflated expectations and your harsh judgements of yourself than it has to do with the actual result of the day.

How else can you go and shoot 80 twice in the space of a year in two of the biggest majors and lose, and then come back with the lowest winning score in US Open history? You are either very naive, or you have got it right to not judge your self-worth according to your scores, a great place to be for any golfer.

Same gun different target

After the little matter of starting 65-66-68 McIlroy was asked in his Saturday press conference whether he had

learnt anything from his disappointments of St. Andrews and Augusta. The second part to the question was the kicker: did he think that by being more conservative he was playing better? The answer in typical Irish style was a "Doozie", and something that if you work on executing it is not only a great game tool but also a wonderful mental tool.

McIlroy went on to describe that he did not purposefully avoid the driver after St. Andrews and Augusta but that he did make better decisions in terms of risk and reward with that club. Meaning he would not hit it when he did not feel the odds were completely in his favour of hitting the fairway.

Secondly, on par-5's if he chose to hit lay-ups he tried to hit those lay-ups with the same aggression as he would hit a full shot as he felt he had let himself down by hitting some bad lay-ups in the past by not committing to them

fully (paraphrased by a psychologist of course). So basically: same gun and aggression, different target.

That was the difference between two 8o's, and running away from the field. Not re-inventing your swing, not a new driver, not firing your swing coach, putting coach, agent and clothing sponsor. None of the above happened as they would have with some of the modern day prima donnas, rather just good old-fashioned stand-up-and-take-responsibility decision making.

Rory McIlroy may have had some of the most famous "chokes" in the history of the game, but now he also has one of the most famous victories to go with it. At the expense of my inbox being clogged with abusive messages from my friends again, I'll go out on a limb and say he'll have many more of the latter before he has any more of the former.

RECENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS?





Over the past couple of weeks we have received an array of various questions from members and guests. We are here to assist and provide the answers, no matter how big or small.

We remind members of our open door policy, transparency and we encourage constructive feedback to keep improving our wonderful club.

In the newsletter each month we will post the top 'recently asked questions', and if you require more detail, lets have a coffee.



Q: Why are we still doing virtual prize givings?

A: Unfortunately, the COVID -19 virus is still with us and the Club continues to put safety first. Additionally, the current restrictions under alert level 3, don't allow for more than 50 pax to attend 'a gathering'.

Q: How does the R30 Covid -19 responsibility fee per round work?

A: We regard the safety and well-being of our members, guests, staff and caddies of the utmost importance and take every proactive measure to provide a safe environment. Due to the Club performing better financially, as of 2 March 2021 the covid fee will reduce from R30 - R20. (R10 continues to be allocated to the caddy subsidy fund and the remaining R10 towards PPE, consumables and other safety measures).

Q: When is the members clubcard discount coming back?

A: Tuesday, 2 March 2020 (5%)

Q: What happened to my tree? (Arbor day program)

A: The plan was to start purchasing and setting certain species in March 2020 surrounding the West Course renovation. Then lockdown hit and everything was placed on hold. This was followed by the West course renovation being cancelled. We now await a new direction regarding the future of the West course renovation and the strategic planting required. However, either way, we are aiming to start purchasing next summer and planting will still happen this year.

(The funds raised currently sit on the Club's balance sheet).

Q: Why have the greens slowed down?

A: 130mm of soaking rain from 25 Jan - 8 Feb. So far it's been the wettest summer in 20 years. We are however doing our utmost to speed up greens inbetween rainfall.

Q: How do competition fees A: Traditionally and at most clubs in the country, competition fees are not only collected to offset/provide prizes, but also cover other member expenses like league, hole in one insurance, member consumables etc. Additionally, the Club still funds approximately

Competition Handicap Allowances


Obtaining your Course Handicap and Competition Playing Handicap

FROM THE HNA APP:

- **1.** Download and log into the free HNA Handicaps & Tournament App.
- **2.** Click on the Course Handicap tab, which can be found on the App's landing page.
- **3.** On the bottom of the Course Handicaps Page is an option called Apply Allowance, which allows you to select a percentage that is applicable to the day's competition. The club should advise you which percentage to select.
- **4.** The App will then provide you with a Course Handicap and a Competition Playing Handicap. The Competition Playing Handicap would be used to calculate your score for the club competition.

FROM OTHER SOURCES:

- The Competition Playing Handicap can be obtained in the same way from the club terminal or the HNA website.
- Some clubs will print out your Competition Playing Handicap on your payment receipt.
- Clubs can post Competition Playing Handicap Conversion Tables on the noticeboard.



Entering your score

- Enter your score for handicap purposes using your Course Handicap.
- The Competition Playing Handicap is only used for your competition score.

If you have any doubts about what to enter on the HNA Handicap System, simply enter your gross score per hole and press Enter Score – the system will automatically adjust your score for Net Double Bogey using your Course Handicap and calculate your Score Differential. This can be done on the App, the terminal or on the website.

Filling in your scorecard

For competitions, capture both your Course Handicap and your Competition Playing Handicap in the Handicap section of the scorecard.

NB: you will only use your Playing Handicap to calculate your competition score.



Your monthly golf tip
