

## From the Clock Tower

It was painful to watch the USA team clinch victory at this year's Ryder Cup, 19-9!!!, which is the largest margin of victory in Ryder Cup history since the 28-point format came about. It is the first time since 1979 and 1983 that Team USA has won back-to-back home Ryder Cups after winning in 2016 at Hazeltine. The Americans lost in 2018 in France (I was there, it was epic®), and seven of the last 10 Ryder Cups against Europe, so a dominant 2021 victory could change the tide in the rivalry. But let us keep hope as we have some of the young Europeans waiting in the wings and hopefully come Rome 2023, we can issue some of the same medicine.

On the 22<sup>nd</sup> of September the Club held the 130<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting which was well attended by 114 members. We thank those members for taking the time to attend a very successful AGM. Perhaps the most telling indication of a Club that is capable of evolving, is in its ability to agree, support and adapt for the future. Welcome to level 1, our Marketing Manager will shortly launch and announce the title sponsor for the 2021 Festival of Golf, which will take place from 23 – 28 November 2021. In the meantime, save the date and we look forward to the return of the festival and hope for another spectacular event.





After a successful hollowtining treatment that was performed on our West course in early September, the greens have recovered. Although they remain a little furry, putt slower than usual and are still bumpy, this is natural due to their grass type being poa annua and following the required fertilizer applications on these greens.

The poa annua greens did take somewhat longer to recover largely because of a few cold spells and because of having to double hollow tine problem areas on these aged greens. We are now focusing on final mowing heights for the summer and implementing our seasonal chemical applications that will assist the greens in growing more laterally, in turn providing a smoother and better ball roll. Unfortunately, this can only be done once the greens have grown through their hollowtining phase. During the treatment week we also hollowtined the tees and target areas in fairways that become waterlogged in summer due to excessive rains. With the same process in mind, the team have now moved over to the championship East course for treatments in the last week of September.



In last month's course article, we highlighted the stressful period our facility endures in the first part of spring, annually, due to water constraints and how other golfing facilities have different water sources. At this time of year every facility follows best practice according to their means. Our courses are very dry currently due to limited water reserves, but the positives are that we tend to burn/dry out the cool season or poa annua grasses in our kikuyu naturally and use less chemicals to eradicate this. Our courses will also handle rainfall better once the rains do arrive.

We are eager to get our courses back to being lush green once again and as we remain hopeful and anticipate what is seemingly a good rain forecast for early October, we have acquired the necessary fertiliser stock in the meantime and will be applying once our water availability improves.

We would like to remind members that our facility is unique not only in size but due to our water source being mainly rainfall and in turn our dams only collecting water through run-off of this storm water. Our dams are essentially our "banks reserves" so to speak and when there is very little, if any, coming in, we need to preserve and balance what is going out onto our golf courses.

Our boreholes that were re-instated have assisted us greatly in times of need, however, these are also not complete solutions and can dry up from time to time. It is unadvisable for us to fertilise too early as we do not have sufficient water to back up daily irrigation at this time and should a drought occur (as in 2015) we run the very real risk and possibility of wasting money and fertilizer by applying prematurely. Excessive and premature conditioning before our seasonal rains can also lead to thatch accumulation and waterlogged areas which are problems later in the season.

We note that the playability and texture of our bunker sand is also problematic, until the rains arrive. Our East course dam is still to be completed and whilst we usually water the sand to improve the consistency and firm them up, it has been difficult to perform this due to the construction of our dam this past winter. The addition of some extra sand has potentially exacerbated the playability problem, but our bunkers did require more sand and as soon as we can get some more moisture into the bunkers, playability will improve.

Some of our tees too have taken a beating due to scarifying, hollowtining, dry weather and excessive

wear in particular areas and the team have moved tee markers around to alleviate this. We are focusing our irrigation practices mainly on tees and greens currently during the dry spell.

We realise the months of treatments coupled with dry weather and turf can become too much to bear but thank the members for their understanding and support during this time of year. As we all know, the rains will come, and the team are performing the necessary treatments currently to prepare the grounds for rain and

the wonderful conditions we have all come to expect for summer golf.





Kian Rose is at Clemson University, in South Carolina and is the only freshmen to make the first team who are in the top ten colleges of division 1. In the first tournament of their new season, Clemson finished

second, one shot off the pace of the winners, Georgia Tech. Kian was 10 under for the three rounds.

There is a story to this! In the second round of the tournament, on the 7th hole, Kian hit his ball to the right, just off the fairway into the semi rough or the first cut. When he got to his ball, there was a very large rattlesnake lying near it and no amount of coaxing this rattlesnake was going to get it to move. Kian and his playing partners needed to identify if it was his ball, which they were unable to do because of the rattlesnake! The lesson that was leant here is to a) make sure your ball is marked and b) if you can't get a rules official to the hole were the incident occurs, you need to play two balls. The first ball option, is a free drop, a safe distance from, in this case where the rattlesnake was lying, where the ball landed and not nearer the hole. The second ball option is to play a second ball by going back to the tee and play three off the tee. As Kian didn't or couldn't identify his ball, he just went back to the tee and played 3 off the tee to make a triple bogey. This resulted in three extra shots, ultimately costing the team first place as they lost by one. I bet that was a lesson well learnt- good luck Kian for the next round in Texas next week.

Kian's dad Trevor was telling me that when Kian arrived at the university earlier this year for pre-season, he was about 30 to 40 yards behind his teammates. Now, after working out at the gym, he is only between 5 and 10 yards behind his team mates off the tee. I can see a lot of members working out, especially in the 60-year-old plus category in our new gym that will be opening later this year!! We might find the boys going for green in two on 11 East next winter (wink. wink).




Sam McKenzie is at Midland College, Texas and they compete in the NJCAA Division. Sam started last season and made the GCAA (Golf Coaches Association of America), NJCAA Division 1 Ping All- American Team in June 2021. Sam finished eighth in the NJCAA Division 1 Nationals and is ranked second in his division. They have started the season with a big bang, winning their first tournament with the combined total of minus 30 and Sam came fourth on an individual score of minus 8 under over 36 holes.



Sam has made the final list for the 2021 Jack Nicklaus Award – an award offered to the nation's top men's college golfers in their various divisions. This award is given annually to the nation's top collegiate golfers across divisions 1, 2 and 3 as well as in the NAIA and NJCAA divisions. It is one of the college games most sought-after awards and some of the previous winners in their respective divisions include Tiger Woods, Phil Mickelson and Justin Thomas. Another South African on the nominee list is Ryan Van der Klis, brother of Steve van der Klis, of ScoreCapture – Ryan is in the NAIA division.

The boys from Clemson were fortunate to visit the Ping putter vault at Ping's Head office. They keep a replica putter for every professional golfer who plays with a Ping putter, in this vault so they can send the same type of putter to the professional in the event something happens on tour to the professional's putter.



I see a massive opportunity for our resident Pro, Greg Jacobs! He has the workshop at the back of the shop, which could be turned into a putter vault!! I can see a roaring trade of putters being kept for our members, as I know of quite a few members who seem to change their putters on a fairly regular basis due to shafts not being too straight!



## **SWING THOUGHTS**

Theo is a psychologist, guest-lecturer and self-confessed sports nut. He is the founder of BVP Sport Psychology as well as the current High Performance Psychologist for GolfRSA. Theo has a professional philosophy that performance (good or bad) is not co-incidental. He therefore encourages clients to maintain both physical and mental processes and routines that lead to consistent performances and a consistent life.

A 100.

That is the amount of swing coaches Brad Faxon, PGA Tour winner and putting legend, has worked with in his career. If that number doesn't blow you away the next number will:

Zero (or close to it).

As in the amount of putting coaches he has worked with in his life!

I discovered these facts while doing research for a presentation I did recently on the short game and in particular, putting.



As astounding as it was to realize how many swing instructors Faxon has consulted it was even more interesting to note that one of the greatest putters of the modern era has not received much "putting coaching". Talk about being a "modern" player in one aspect of the game and a complete "throwback" in another!

In this month's RJK Swing Thoughts we do a deep dive into the mind of a player who epitomised the moniker of "drive for show and putt for dough" and how his mental approach to becoming a great putter is accessible to all of us.

Unique doesn't mean uninformed

Faxon sites an interaction he had with Ben Crenshaw early in his career as a catalyst for becoming the putter he would later be. The main point Crenshaw made? Relax. Not only that but he also did very few things like players are taught these days. He would take the putter back further than he followed through and mentioned that he didn't mind lower body movement! Talk about giving a short game coach a heart attack.

This is not me engaging in an argument between science and nature and which one is better for getting the ball in the hole. One cannot argue that the scientific aspect of the game, and in particular, the science of the short-game, has given us many advances. However, it is also important to remember that many aspects of golf, when executed well, are still a balance between art and science.

This trade-off is the one most golfers are unwilling to accept. For some they need more science in their game while others would be better served doing things that come more naturally to them. Your task as a golfer when it comes to the mental side of your putting? Figure out which side you are more in need of. Brad Faxon surely did.

"Don't have dinner with bad putters"

This gem was offered up by the legendary Harvey Penick and Faxon sites this as a mind-set he stuck to during his playing days. As Faxon alludes to it might be a cliché but if you don't heed this advice you will soon find yourself on the receiving end of some bad putting imagery and overly negative talk about one of the most important parts of the game.

Why do players love talking badly about their putting? I believe it is due to two factors:

One is pure embarrassment. Putting is straight-forward, you either make it or you miss it. Our acceptance as golfers is not similarly dualistic and many players feel the need to "explain away" or blame other factors. The second aspect is that misery loves company. For every player I work with that believes that they are good at putting I have at least 8 to 9 that have spoken themselves into bad putting. It seems that the other 8 or 9 players love to share horror stories about their 3, 4 and 5 putts when they are together.

Once again things are never exactly how they seem with putting and one doesn't just become a bad putter through a few negative comments. However, when negative comments become a habit and blaming becomes a pattern you had better start changing how you think when you are on the greens. Either that or the other committed readers of this column are going to avoid you at all cost.

#### Practice with different clubs

It is a well-known fact that Faxon worked with the renowned psychologist Dr. Bob Rotella and he speaks about how in one of their first sessions Rotella caught him by surprise. Faxon spoke about how he was tense about his putting and how he felt very technical about this part of his game. Rotella gave him a simple task: take out your 5-wood and try to get the ball in the hole using it as a putter.

Faxon dutifully ran through his whole bag of "putters" and even used the heel and leading edges of his putter. Not only did he not do too badly he even made a few. Rotella's message? You are talented and skilled enough to make putts with any club in your bag.

Surely that doesn't apply to me Theo? It most certainly does dear Royal Member. Many golfers I work with give themselves less credit they deserve for their talent and skill. This game is a great way of reminding yourself of the skill and talent you possess to get the ball in the hole, regardless of the tool you use.

I am not saying putt with your 3-wood on Sunday on West. However, I am saying that the fun you will have while putting with your driver will remind you why you fell in love with golf in the first place and getting the ball in the hole. 

## RUHAN'S WINE CELLAR

With Heritage Day and October right on our doorstep and spring now in full swing, we are celebrating all things South African from Heritage to Wine, and what better wine than the uniquely South African Varietal that is Pinotage. With loads of producers in South Africa, there are lots to choose from and the quality is exceptional. My two picks this month are the Lanzerac Pinotage and the award winning Rijks Pinotage but before we get into them, let's talk Pinotage for a bit, the story behind it and where it originates from.

Pinotage is a red wine grape that is South Africa's signature variety, with smokey, fruity and earthy flavours, sometimes with notes of bananas and tropical fruit - there is so much to talk about when the topic of Pinotage, a uniquely South African grape, comes up. From historic tales of creation — merging Pinot Noir and Hermitage (Cinsaut) grapes — to today's legends crafting the latest Pinotage or Pinotage blends. The Pinotage tale is one worth telling and should always end where it is enjoyed with friends, food or maybe even somewhere alone with a bottle of Pinotage as your company.

The story of Pinotage starts with its creator, Prof. Abraham Izak Perold. Perold's academic achievements paved the way for the creation of Pinotage and included a B.A. degree in Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry, Ph.D in Chemistry (Germany) and a temporary professorship in Chemistry at the University of Cape Town. This background equipped him with a very unique skill set and after his professorial stint in 1906 the Cape government, wanting to extend the range of grapes planted in the region, sent Perold on a grape varietal scouting mission. Upon his return with 177 varietals he became the first professor of Viticulture at Stellenbosch University and later became Dean of the Faculty of Agriculture. He joined the KWV in 1927 and made a huge contribution to the wine industry during his time there. To this day the 177 varietals still form part of a collection at the Welgevallen Experimental Farm of the University of Stellenbosch.

In 1925 Perold successfully crossed Pinot noir and Cinsaut, which was then known as Hermitage. Hence the name Pino — tage. Prof. CJ Theron succeeded in rescuing and reproducing the original seedlings, of which there were only four, and undertook the considerable task of evaluation.





Sixteen years later, Charl Theron de Waal (known as CT de Waal), produced the first barrel of Pinotage wine in 1941 in Stellenbosch. The name appeared on a wine label for the first time in 1961, namely the SFW's 1959 Lanzerac Pinotage. Nobody's been bottling Pinotage longer than Lanzerac and this wine shows a wealth of experience with this proudly South African variety. The 2018 Pinotage boasts an excellent deep colour, ripe berries and plums on the nose and palate with a good mouth-feel and lingering aftertaste. With 5 to 10 years' maturation, this wine will start to acquire the velvet density and luxurious chocolate and caramel flavours of its very early Lanzerac predecessors. A full-bodied, complex wine with a beautiful balance between fruit and wood showcasing a good tannin structure that will allow it to age extremely well. Pair this proudly South African wine with flavourful dishes such as Kalahari venison medallions with a plum sauce, Cajun-spiced 'blackened' fish or a traditional Cape Malay curry.

The Rijks Private Cellar Pinotage from Award Winning Winemaker Pierre Wahl is regarded as a superlative one. This deep coloured Pinotage lives up to its expectations with its complex nose showing off layers of blackberry, as well as red berry aromas. Some mulberry notes, with underlying coconut and cinnamon spice on the nose are also present. Silky, elegant tannins keep this wine in perfect harmony and balance on a rich, mouth filling palate.


Pinotage matches best with meats like venison, goat, and lamb. You can also easily pair Pinotage with beef as well, though I'd recommend heavier cuts like flank steak or skirt steak. Lamb kebabs, burgers, and grilled pork chops will also pair well with Pinotage. It can handle a spicy sauce like mesquite BBQ sauce or sweet fruity sauces like plum sauce; both bring out a different character of the wine.




