On behalf of the Board, management and staff, we welcome you to 2023 at Royal. We hope that you and your loved ones enjoyed some quality time together over the holiday season.

Our focus for the year ahead is to keep becoming more sustainable, more efficient and innovative and to ensure the member value proposition and facility offering continues to reach new heights. As we start the calendar, we will continue to face the immense challenges that face our country, the economy and in turn, our business.

Load shedding remains a very costly concern and is currently consuming potential club profits. At an average cost of R6 000 a day in fuel, it is simply not sustainable. As communicated, the Board has received two power purchase proposals for solar and we look to approve an agreement at the March Board meeting and implement the solar solution by May. The signed agreement, will meet all our objectives and secure reliable, cost effective energy through a car port solution on a no capital basis.

"Mother Nature" is speaking to us louder than than ever before and it's been a turbulent summer to say the least - from record rainfall, to sweltering heat waves! We are certainly hoping for more 'stable' weather conditions in the weeks ahead and our sincere appreciation to our course manager and his team, for delivering wonderful conditions despite the extreme changes in climate. The Old Oak Restaurant and Family Centre continues to grow in demand and the facility experienced a record turnover in December, which fortunately supplemented the loss of golf rounds due to rain. The facility is slowly maturing, expanding with outsourced catering and without doubt, becoming the first choice for family dining in Gauteng. Please keep a look out for some of the fantastic evenings and author events on the calendar, including a night with Chris Bertish in February and rugby legend John Smit in March. Thanks to our chefs and front-line staff for continually pushing memorable experiences, refined dining, better procurement and creating special occasions, which ensure this fantastic venue continues to go from strength

The dawn of a new year also brings new opportunities and many exciting projects. The Club has announced that we will be implementing padel tennis - the fastest growing sport on the planet. In the month of February, Africa Padel (www.africapadel.com) will start the construction of extending the car park and building three courts, a padel pro shop and hospitality area on the west side of the car park (old bowling green parking). This will include new landscaping, be child friendly, aesthetically pleasing and offer an area for us to provide food & beverage. The model is very similar to golf, with lots of synergy and economies of scale (hence the location), and it will be profitable from the outset and add an additional offering to members. Padel certainly compliments the 'Country Club' aspect and aligns with our mission to keep creating new revenue streams, superseding value, on a no risk basis. Once construction is complete (May), we look forward to launching the padel proposition to our members.

As communicated toward the end of 2022, the Cabinet office in the UK formally approved the name change of the Club, in line with the special resolution approved by the members at the 131st AGM. We are working with graphic designers on 'new' corporate identity and branding, which should be complete by March and then we aim to launch the new Club logo and name by May. In this regard, we remind members that the name change of the Club is for PR and marketing purposes. The legal trading name of the Club will remain the same.

Over the past month, we have started welcoming many homeowners into the residential membership – on behalf of the Club, we welcome you to your new home and the Royal lifestyle. We are looking forward to seeing you at the Club and wish you many happy and wonderful years in residence.

As the Club's moniker goes 'The Royal Experience', underlines the great support of the members, which is amplified by the management and Board's drive to continually enhance our Club for the future.

Despite all the challenges, we have so much to look forward too in 2023.



We wish all members many more birdies for 2023.

Following the letter sent to the membership on the 17th of January – the intention of the communication was sent in the best interest of enhancing Royals standards, decorum and to get the most out of our wonderful facility. We are appealing to all members to take the responsibility and leave the course in a better condition than it was found.

Regarding lifts to staff, outsourced staff and or service providers - we were made aware of a few hijacking incidents reported in and around the Gauteng region, which allegedly involve service providers to clubs. We ask members and guests to be aware and to please be safe when offering lifts to anyone for your own safety.

The Club has introduced a few fun initiatives which will take place every Wednesday and Friday evening for those who struggle to fit in golf during the week.

We have introduced 5@5 every Wednesday, which is five players, with five clubs and the length of the game is only 5 holes. We will change the competition weekly and encourage members to bring their kids and join in the fun. The first tee time available is 17h00 and the hole stretch is the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 9th East.

On a Friday afternoon we have introduced a sundowner's competition which is over nine holes kicking off at 15h30. These are a couple of the great events and we hope to see members taking part. The Central Gauteng league season is about to kick off on all fronts with better ball league facing their first fixtures this weekend, the 29th of January. The last season was a great one for the Club and we'd like to congratulate all teams on a spectacular 2022 year and as we look to the 2023 season, we hope for another strong showing from all teams.

Golf RSA released a new set of rules regarding the information that a player is expected to put on their scorecard. The need for putting the players course handicap and playing handicap is now not compulsory and players will not be penalised if they do not enter this information. But in saying that, if you chose not to enter that information, we will need to know the tee colour you elected to play off to ensure we allocate the correct handicap.



FROM EAST TO WEST

What turned out to be an abnormally wet spring and start to the summer season, quickly turned into one of the driest January months we have experienced in 10 years at Royal with only 20mm for the month in total, the lowest recorded. Royal also seen its' highest annual rainfall in 10 years with 1422.2mm of rain falling from Jan – Dec 2022, of which 640mm rainfall was recorded from October to December 2022. Even though the rain was excessive, one never complains when it rains as it is always needed.

Maintenance on the courses has fallen slightly behind due to the festive season but the staff have put in some extra hard work to have the courses back on track with all the mowing requirements.

The East course hollow tining took place on the 6th of January and has gone as smoothly as it could. The recovery is going quicker than anticipated and the greens will be picking up their pace again during the first week of February, leading up to Club Champs. Furthermore, we have utilized the weeks closure to complete small sodding tasks on the fairways and bridge crossings along with cleaning out the dam on the 5th East. We have also attended to most of the drainage issues on East, with a few final touch ups that need to be completed but fortunately these are out of play area so it should not cause any inconvenience.



At the end of December and start of January we found an old stormwater pipe on the 6th West that had been blocked off. The team is hard at work trying to complete this and repair the issue. We have also found old drainage lines as well as old irrigation lines which have caused most of the water damage and continuously wet conditions on the West during the high rainfall period. We will start to unblock these pipes and restore them to get the courses drained quicker for play.

Golf etiquette has improved vastly with the raking of bunkers on both courses, however, what has not improved is the amount of unrepaired pitch marks on both East and West. With the West greens being so firm, the ball tends to release more than older greens and one tends not to look for the pitch mark due to nothing being close to the ball. I urge members and visitors to please be mindful of this when playing the west. We will conduct regular dusting on both courses to aid with the firmness of the greens and recovery of the pitch marks, but it remains every golfers responsibility to repair their own pitch mark and one other one. I wish all participants good luck in the upcoming Club Champs – have fun out there and may the best player win. ROYAL JHB & KENSINGTON GC



With the new year's plan of excellence in full swing, it brings me great pleasure to introduce a few wines that are made with exactly that focus and strive for excellence. I was very lucky to have had a tasting with Meridian Wine Merchants Sommelier, Duane Hendricks and Sales Manager for Mullineux & Leeu Family Wines, Nicola Tipping. After a long struggle to get our hands on the Leeu Passant Cabernet Sauvignon when we first opened The Old Oak, our efforts and meetings paid off and they agreed to add us to their yearly allocation. These were some of the best wines that Chef Ransley Pietersen and I have tasted to date and The Old Oak can brag today on receiving a case of each of their selection, which now forms part of our off list wines. Stocks are extremely limited so be on the lookout for the following wines from Leeu Passant Family Wines – Leeu Passant Stellenbosch Cabernet Sauvignon, Leeu Passant Red Blend, Leeu Passant Wellington, Old Vines Basson Cinsault, Leeu Passant Franschhoek and Old Vines Lötter Cinsault

The Leeu Collection's founder, Analjit Singh (aka BAS), is a partner in Mullineux & Leeu Family Wines with Chris and Andrea Mullineux and they are the team behind these celebrated wines produced on Farm in the Roundstone Swartland appellation and at Leeu Estates in Franschhoek. By 2021, Mullineux & Leeu Family Wines had notched up over 45 fivestar ratings from Platter's South African Wine Guide since its' first release in 2008, and was also named the wine guide's Winery of the Year in 2014, 2016, 2019 and 2020 - the first winery in South Africa to achieve this accolade four times. 

What is Golf Fitness, and how will it help?

There is a cloud of misconception around golf fitness. A lot of people believe that it is only for the tour pros, because they need to make that marginal difference in a tournament week. But that is not true. Sure, the tour players need to be at their physical best to compete week in and week out. The everyday golfer can create more marginal benefit from following a personalized training programme than the benefit created by any tour pro. Golf fitness works in 3 major areas – speed, longevity and pain free golf.



Speed training focuses on force production. This means using your body to effectively and efficiently deliver as much force as possible through the club to the ball.

Longevity training refers to keeping golfers on the course as long as possible. Good joint health and strong muscle balance will keep golfers golfing for many years.

Pain free golf is in the area of injury rehabilitation and injury prevention. Any injury limits the enjoyment of golf, from painful ankles to a stiff neck and everything in between. This is coupled with returning to golf after any sort of injury.

The tool used to screen for strength and flexibility limits and abilities is the Titleist Performance Institute screening. It is the gold standard in Golf Fitness, and widely used across the world. The TPI philosophy is "We don't believe there is one way to swing a club; we believe there are an infinite number of ways to swing a club. But we do believe that there is one efficient way for everyone to swing a club and it is based on what they can physically do."

Our resident Biokineticist, Dale Ebell, is registered with the HPCSA and the Biokinetics Association of South Africa. Since graduating in 2011 he has worked in a variety of practice environments, focusing on orthopedic injury rehabilitation and promotion of performance. He has had the opportunity to work under some of the best mentors within the golf space, promoting his knowledge of the golf swing and the physical requirements for an efficient swing. He is Titleist Performance Institute Certified and has completed the Golf Fitness Specialization through the NASM in the United States. Along with his work in the performance space, he also has a deep knowledge of chronic musculoskeletal issues that affect golfers, including arthritis and lower back pain. Using his skills and knowledge he can aid in creating longevity in the game.

AIMPOINT GOLF

Viktor Hovland and AimPoint

Viktor won the Hero World Challenge two years back to back Dec 2021 and Dec 2022!

Viktor Hovland revealed the new putting technique which helped him to defend his title at the Hero World Challenge at Albany Golf Club.



Just as in 2021, Hovland finished ahead of Scottie Scheffler back in second place. The young Norwegian carded a final-round 69 to seal the deal by two shots before posing for a picture with the trophy and Woods himself.

After the final round, Hovland revealed that his putting recently underwent a significant shift in technique. He works with Jeff Smith, the Director of Instruction at Eagle Springs GC in Colorado and a Top 100 instructor. They teamed up back in 2020.

Hovland claims he was misreading 15-foot putts by two feet at Karsten Creek, just outside of Stillwater, Oklahoma where he lives. A concerning image considering he is a three-time PGA Tour winner and World No. 9. Smith introduced AimPoint putting to him, the putting routine that has become popular in the amateur and professional games. Hovland felt inspired once Smith instilled this technique into his arsenal and he was able to end his year in perfect fashion.

As Hovland says, this method doesn't guarantee a perfect quick fix to your short game. Weather conditions and the speed of the green are other variables which you still need to calculate in your mind too.

Other players such as Dustin Johnson, Adam Scott, Justin Rose, Stacey Lewis and Lydia Ko have also used AimPoint. There is method to the madness and this showed with another strong display in December from Hovland.
