It's been a whirlwind month at the Club, with lots of corporate golf, events and of course the opening of Padel@Royal. The opening of padel is another significant milestone at the Club, as we continue to evolve into a family inclusive Club, with top facilities and an experience that members and guests would struggle to find elsewhere. The overall quality and value proposition at Royal has never been greater!

In this regard, my gratitude and sincere appreciation to Africa Padel and all the teams involved in the launch. We also thank the members who have sent such wonderful feedback. Over the past ten years the Club has conducted the annual member survey, a process that exercises transparency and sets the stage for the Club to view member perception, insight and data for continual progress.

Over this time the overall weighted satisfaction average, across the Club has increased by 20.2% The survey for 2022/23 was distributed on 13 April (via Survey Monkey) and closed on Friday the 28th and the Club has released the results and high level data.

We are delighted and thankful to report an overall satisfaction level of 97% and a weighted improvement form 84.6% to 85.5%. We thank each member who took the time to participate and those who provided additional feedback. What next? Within this newsletter the Club is launching a bi- monthly series of 'snapshot' surveys, which will target specific operational topics and areas. We will keep travelling the road of the majority members, drive progress, improvement, development and a better future!

The Club has officially launched its new brand and the positive feedback from the membership and greater golfing community has been overwhelming. The rebranding stays faithful to everything our existing members and customers love and without limitation, it opens up opportunities to build stronger relationships with younger customers.

With our unique appeal, shortened name and united symbol, we will use our new identity to extend to all areas of our Club, with a fresh approach, to create further opportunities to promote our membership, facilities, culture, events and services. The new brand will be rolled out over a two to three year period (as practical and feasible) and merchandise will shortly become available in Greg Jacobs Golf Shop. We also remind members that the name change of the Club is for PR and marketing purposes but the legal trading name of the Club will remain the same. The Club will also find a suitable and fitting position to keep and celebrate the Kensington name.



It is with excitement and relief, that we now head towards our next big project at the Club – the first phase of our Solar carports. The construction is set to get underway toward the end of June (pending stock availability) and will take approximately 6 weeks to complete. Phase one will be the carport with solar panels, which will take us 40% off grid. Phase two (battery install) will start in September and take us 70–80% off grid. Members are to note that there will be temporary inconvenience to parking during the first phase and the club will continue to run a shuttle service over busy days.

As we approach the Club's financial year end, at 30 June 2023, we urge all members who have not yet settled their dues for the new year, starting 1 July, to please do so and take advantage of the fantastic 'early bird' incentives. Congratulations, to Gillian Lee for wining the early bird –April incentive. Gillian walks away with a brand new set of Titleist irons, standbag, Old Oak voucher and 'head-to-toe' under armour outfit.

It's hard to believe our Old Oak Restaurant is a year old already and what a first year it has been. R11.5m in sales, over 68 000 meals served and of-course being voted the best luxury family restaurant in SA to top it off! We thank all the members and our wonderful teams for all the support and bringing the vision to life.

In closing, the negative climate outside the Club, is very noticeable amongst some people's behaviour and it's clear how stressed society is in general and whilst we aim to provide members and guests with an escape from reality, we ask members to assist the Club in upholding the high calibre of standards, respect and expectations. It is the members and staff who shape our wonderful Club culture and this must be maintained.

We hope you enjoy the additional content and the new look and feel of the monthly newsletter!





FROM EAST TO WEST

Our winter months have officially started, frost has started to set in lower lying areas and in the roughs and soon the golf courses will be covered in frost leaving us with very chillier mornings than what we would like. This also means that we need to adapt our maintenance schedules in terms of mowing. As soon as frost starts appearing on the greens more regularly, we will start mowing greens in the afternoons as this limits any mechanical damage on the greens in terms of ice accumulating on the rollers and damage to the leaf. I am also pleading to all golfers using carts to please stay in the rough if frost is visible - driving over grass with ice on breaks up the leaf causing a very unsightly look to the golf courses.





We have multiple exciting projects on the go from the start of June. We will be starting to level the tee's on all the Par 3's on the West course and this project will be split into two parts to limit the disruption to golf. We will first be start with all the mens back tee's, then allow five weeks of recovery and then start on the second part with the remainder of the tee's. The plan is to have all the Par 3 completed by end tee's of July. Unfortunately, there are only two sets of tee's on the par 3's aside from 17 West so this means that the course will be playing shorter than normal for this period. While we are busy with this project, we will also be taking the opportunity to widen some of these tee's as best as possible to allow for more space to rotate the tee's more frequently. This also means that we can prolong the timeline until they need to be re-levelled again.

As soon as the Par 3 tee's are done, we will be targeting all the remainder of the unlevel tee's on West, one by one.

We have already started with some winter maintenance on West. All the mowing of the veldgrass and the boundaries will be completed by the end of May after which, we will move across to the East course and have that completed by the end of June. This winter we will also do a major clean-up of all the water sluits around the course. With the possibility of the El-Nino approaching we want to ensure that all these "gutters" are clean to allow any rain falling to go into our irrigation dams at maximum capacity. This is also very important for when we have huge storms to ensure the water runs in the appropriate channels and keeps the course as dry as possible. Another project on the go is the cleaning of the compost yards. We are busy turning the East compost yard into a complete grass nursery for our golf courses as this will take us away from taking sods from the driving range. The West compost yard will become our recycling site for any natural refuge from the golf courses. Spraying off all the clover weeds will also be starting in June – we had planned this to have been done in May but with the unexpected rainfall we had, it had to be delayed.

The late rains we have received have been surprising and we have recorded a total of 96mm for May, which is the most rain we have experienced in the last decade. This past season is best described as a 'yo-yo'- it's been one extreme to the next and the courses has certainly felt this drastic change in each month. I look forward to seeing everyone out on the golf courses – keep warm.

The day hopes to inspire people to embrace the values <u>that Mand</u>ela shared.


THE CAPTAINS CORNER

WINE, WHISKEY& MORE!

With another month behind us, we celebrate The Old Oak turning 1 year old, and how better to celebrate than with Tequila. In this month's column I will be discussing Tequila and we will go through the main differences between Tequila and Mezcal and later on we will look at flavoured tequilas and common tequila myths.

What is tequila? Mexico's iconic spirit.

No other drink is surrounded by as many stories, myths, legends and lore as tequila and its companion, mezcal. Tequila transcends simple definition by reaching into the heart of Mexico, past and present. It blends indigenous and Spanish cultures with Filipino and Arabian technology.

At its most basic, tequila is an alcoholic, distilled drink made in the arid highlands of central Mexico, from fermented and distilled sap of one species of agave (also called a maguey), an indigenous plant (a succulent related to the lily family, not a cactus). Archaeologists say agaves have been cultivated for at least 9,000 years, and used as food for even longer. The agave has woven its fibres through the entire course of Mexican history.

'Tequila wine' was first made by the Conquistadors within a few decades of their arrival. Today, most of it is made in Jalisco state around the towns of Tequila and Arandas, using only one species of plant: the blue agave.

Tequila is an androgynous word, being written as both el tequila and la tequila in Spanish; masculine and feminine (although the masculine form is more commonly used). Tequila is technically a mezcal, as are all agave spirits, but it is limited as to where it can be produced and where its source agave can be grown. Like cognac is a brandy from a specific region of France, tequila is a mezcal from a specific region of Mexico. What is mezcal? Tequila's ancestral spirit. Mezcal (also spelled mescal) is a related distilled spirit, and is the older form of the name for all tequila as well. The name for the product made in Jalisco state - tequila - was adopted in the late 19th century.

Mezcal is actually a generic word that covers a wide range of distilled agave spirits that are made in every Mexican state except Veracruz, Quintana Roo, Campeche and Baja California. It is not a singular product, but should be considered in the plural – mezcals (Sp. mezcales).

Technically, all tequilas are mezcals, which were also known as mezcal wines and mezcal brandies before the name tequila became common and replaced mezcal for that one particular type of mezcal. Today they are distinct products, differentiated by production process, place of origin and taste, much the same way rye whiskey and Scotch whisky differ.

Most mezcal is made in Oaxaca state today, although some (mostly regional and not for export) is also made in Guerrero, Zacatecas, and other states.





Unlocking the Power of Strong Hips for a Pain-Free Swing

Following on from the last months article, we now focus on the link between the hips and the lower back. Many golfers, both amateurs and professionals, have experienced the frustration of back pain affecting their performance and enjoyment of the sport.

AIMPOINT



The beginning of May at Wells Fargo, Justin Thomas explained why he adopted the AimPoint System:

Last Wednesday, in his second week of a two-week break, Thomas got together with his putting coach, John Graham, and someone new: AimPoint Golf founder and developer Mark Sweeney.

"It was probably two or three hours and just worked with him," Thomas said after signing for a second-round 67 that got him to 7 under par, one off the lead shared by Tyrrell Hatton (65), Nate Lashley (66) and Wyndham Clark (67) with the afternoon wave still out on the course.

AimPoint is a system of reading greens used by several top players, including but not limited to Keegan Bradley, Max Homa, and Adam Scott. In part it asks players to feel slope in their feet. So far, you'd have to say it's been working for Thomas, who took 30 putts Thursday and 29 Friday and was finally in positive numbers in Strokes Gained: Putting, gaining around a stroke per round.

"Keegan and Max have both been very helpful for me because they both do it," he said. "I called both of them, I talked to them for a while. Keegan said it best, it's a very simple idea but like a complex system, if you will, or maybe opposite. It's one of those things that once you get it, it's a very generic, pretty simple like bang, go, do it.

"It's just getting comfortable enough with what you're feeling," Thomas continued. "And how everybody feels slope is different. How I feel it might be different than you or Keegan or Max or whatever. At the end of the day, if the ball's going in the hole, who cares, right?"The tournament is only half finished, but Thomas said he's enjoyed taking the guesswork out of his green-reading and feels the new system has potential. It's already helping him get more out of his rounds. Speed & Distance Control

Are you struggling with speed and distance control on the putting green? 


