



FROM EAST TO WEST

As we head into the last month of autumn, we can see how Royal is showcasing its beautiful tree's across the whole property. With that being said, the maintenance team is hard at work collecting leaves on both courses. Yet again we have had record low rainfall recordings for both March and April with only 100mm total for both months. The reality of Global warming is being displayed as we can see the inconsistency in rainfall we have experienced this past season compared to previous years. We have had some concerning early predictions for the next coming season and it seems as if we are heading out of the La Nina stage and straight into the El Nino stage. However, these have been early predictions but can change depending on the type of winter we have – hopefully we will have a normal season next year with good rains.

The pitch marks on the West have become a major concern for us as a maintenance department and the number of unrepaired or incorrectly repaired pitch marks are concerning. We are tasking two staff members each day to repair all pitch marks on a green per day and the incorrectly repaired pitch marks are assisted by adding sand and seed to the speed up the recovery process. What is more concerning, is that we have repaired every pitch mark on the 14th West green two weeks ago with numerous, new unrepaired pitch marks visible. Pitch marks remain a golfers sole responsibility to repair. With pitch marks becoming an extra task for the course team, we are taking staff away from other tasks to repair ball marks caused by golfers. We are pleading to all members and guests to please repair your pitch marks correctly - if you are uncertain on how to fix it correctly you are more than welcome to pop in and either myself or one of the PGA professionals will gladly assist.



We are finalising the planning regarding the levelling of tee's on West this coming winter. We will phase this levelling of the tee's into two stages to allow minimal disruption to golf. We will be starting off on all par 3 tee's and will gradually move over to top the other tee's following winter. Our plan will also include to enlarge some of the teeing area to allow for better rotation of tee markers on the tee's.

Enjoy your golf and please leave the course in a better condition than found.











Look forward to seeing many of you around the Club and on the fairways!





















CAPTAINS CORNER



RUHAN'S WINE / WHISKEY COLUMN

Whisky at The Old Oak Part 3

In last month's column we discussed the differences between Blended Scotch Whiskeys and Single Malt Whiskeys and we classified the Malt Whiskies and divided them into four groups according to the geographical location of the distilleries in which they are made. Furthermore, we can classify the regions into 5 groups – these regions are unique in the way the produce their whiskey but also unique in terms of the flavour profiles they have,

The Five Single Malt Regions of Scotland and Single Malt Scotch Whisky Characteristics

The Lowlands

The Lowlands region lies south of an imaginary line drawn from the Clyde estuary to the Tay estuary. It can claim only three working distilleries. Whiskies from the Lowlands tend to be soft and light in character. They often display very malty, grassy characteristics and subtle delicate aromas. Examples include Glenkinchie, Blandoch and Auchentoshan.



The Highlands

Moving north of the imaginary line takes us in to the Highland region. The region includes most of the rest of Scotland, with the exception of the Island of Islay and Campbeltown, and thus its malts vary greatly in character. Generalisations about the Highland region are less valid, as its whiskies will range from dry to sweet and some even have a touch of smoke and peat. Examples include Glenmorangie, Blair Athol and Talisker.

Speyside

Technically Speyside lies within the Highland region. It is home to approximately half of Scotland's malt whisky distilleries. This small area of land located to the north west of Aberdeen produces mellow, sweet, and particularly fruity malt whiskies. Examples include Glenfiddich, Glenlivet and Macallan.

Islay

Located in the Inner Hebrides, the small Island of Islay is often called 'Whisky Island' given its concentration of eight distilleries. The island produces very distinct malts, generally heavily peated and smoky in taste. Examples include Bowmore, Ardbeg and Laphroaig.

Campbeltown

The town of Campbeltown was once home to more than 30 distilleries. Today it is home to just three: Springbank, Glen Gyle and Glen Scotia. Whiskies from the town tend to have a little peat and salt to them, and are generally medium to full bodied. Examples included Springbank and Glen Scotia.

Hope you enjoy these beautiful whiskeys as much as I do, Cheers!





Why golfers need hip mobility

Hip mobility is crucial for golfers because it plays a fundamental role in generating power, maintaining balance, and achieving an efficient golf swing.

Limited hip mobility can disrupt the sequence and timing of the swing, leading to compensatory movements, such as swaying or sliding, which can result in poor swing mechanics and decreased performance.
- 4. Reducing risk of injury: Golfers, like any athletes, are susceptible to injuries. Limited hip mobility can place additional stress on other parts of the body, such as the lower back or knees, as they compensate for the restricted hip movement. Over time, this can increase the risk of developing overuse injuries, such as muscle strains, joint pain, and even chronic conditions like golfer's elbow or low back pain.
- 5. Improving flexibility: Flexibility is an important component of overall fitness, and hip mobility is a key aspect of overall flexibility for golfers. Adequate hip mobility allows golfers to perform other necessary movements in the golf swing, such as rotation and weight transfer, with ease, and can also improve their ability to perform other aspects of their fitness routine, such as stretching or strength training.

Incorporating hip mobility exercises into a golfer's fitness routine, such as stretching, mobility drills, and targeted exercises, can help enhance performance, reduce the risk of injury, and contribute to a more effective golf swing.
