FROM THE CLOCKTOWER

If good things come in threes, then for left-handers, it would appear they arrive in years ending in three, with Harman's 2023 success following Bob Charles in 1963 and Phil Mickelson in 2013.

In dominant fashion Brian Harman wrapped up the 151st Open Championship and the first major of his career! Amid a sea of umbrellas at a rain-soaked Royal Liverpool, the American weathered a stormy start to lift the Claret Jug. I believe Harman was always going to shoot a conservative final round and the weather prevented the top golfers from scoring a low chase, which saw Harman finish six strokes ahead of Jason Day, Sepp Straka, Tom Kim and Jon Rahm. He was certainly the Champion golfer of the year!





At the time of writing this month's column, the July Board meeting has just concluded and the mission to deliver, invest, protect, grow and evolve the Club, remains the priority. We continue to operate in an environment riddled with external shocks yet I believe the resilience of a great Club lies in its ability to not only traverse adverse conditions but to adapt and succeed as Royal has done over its 132 years.

The Club has completed it's preparations for the annual financial audit, taking place on 1 August 2023. The financial year was certainly a story of two halves and as forecasted, the preliminary results for the year ending, 30 June 2023, reflect the expected operating loss (pre audit), primarily due to the exorbitant fuel bills, the West Course renovation/utilisation and the extreme summer rainfall.

The Club closed its financial year with 57150 rounds of golf played and a 19% increase in membership (1675) including residential members). Following the final payment from our property developers, the Capital Fund value has increased to R16m (R2m more than anticipated).

Considering the plethora of challenges and the continuing macroeconomic environment, the Club is quietly satisfied with what has been invested, the challenges overcome and the many achievements throughout an 'abnormal' trading year.

The new budget and financial forecast for the year ahead is promising and will see a number of our efforts coming to fruition. We are however mindful and planning for headwinds that will further challenge us in the coming years, most notably water, climate, geopolitical uncertainty and the cost of living. We are prepared and remain alert to the potential risks, and the impact they will have on our Club and we take confidence from our strong track record of adapting and thriving in the face of other significant external challenges in recent years.

Overall, we are confident that the strength of our balance sheet, our experienced team and our longer-term approach will enable our Club to continue its' growth journey. We are also pleased to advise that after nearly 12 months of waiting, the first delivery of our new machinery

fleet has finally arrived, which includes the new greens mowers. The new fleet will have a considerable effect on quality of cut, especially in the summer months ahead. The second and final delivery of our fleet will arrive toward the end of the year.

As communicated, the Club has approved the furniture replacement program for the patio, bar and halfway house – the estimated delivery is set for mid-September.

Members will notice the preparations for our solar carports starting in August and the Club will distribute the detailed arrangements (logistics) around parking etc. before the main construction gets underway.

As communicated the timeline for the project was amended due to council delays and we Solarise estimate completion by the end October. Please rest assured of our best efforts to alleviate temporary inconvenience during the project. The Club now progresses with the preparations for the 132nd Annual General Meeting, set to take place on Wednesday, 20 September 2023. The notice of the meeting will be distributed 14 business days prior.

There will be a couple of vacancies to serve on the future Board, namely Treasurer and Captain and we invite and encourage any member who wishes to serve on the Club, to please get in touch with us. Nominations to serve on the Board will close 10 days prior to the AGM and the Royal Review publication (Annual report/e-mag) will be distributed on 8 September 2023. Any member wishing to advertise or contribute to this year's publication, please email marketing@royaljhb.co.za.

The 2023 Past Presidents lunch was held on 19 July, were 16 former leaders of the Club attended this wonderful tradition. We shared the latest developments, challenges and plans for the future and this year's lunch was another special occasion, immersed in the history and stories of Royal. It is a constant reminder that over many decades, the Club has continued to grow and evolve and that the importance of leading the institution can never be taken for granted.

In closing, school holidays are fast approaching and I look forward to taking some annual leave post our annual financial audit, to re-charge the batteries and catch up on some quality time with family. Erik Brakhoven will oversee the management teams responsibilities during my absence and i look forward to seeing you all when i return on 22 August.



FROM EAST TO WEST

The end of the winter season is now upon us, although it only seems like winter is really setting in now. As we all saw, we received a small amount of snow on the 10th of July and this was certainly an exciting experience. I truly believe the snowfall reflected on what a year 2023 has been thus far - from floods to droughts, from heat to snow, we have certainly had all the seasons in one year.

The forecast for the spring and summer seasons still shows a heavy El Nino prediction, with scorching heat to be expected.

The tees that has been levelled on the West course will most likely open within the next two weeks as the cold snap we encountered over the past two weeks, slowed the recovery down. The tees are looking good and we are excited to have them open as soon as possible. We are in the process of planning our spring treatments and will start with scarifying of the golf courses tees and fairways in August and carrying on to mid-September



I know this is a painful inconvenience for golfers, but it is a necessary practice to ensure we have a great playing surface for summer.

August bring much excitement with the first batch of our new machines arriving. New green's mowers will be on both courses, including new mechanical bunker rakes and perhaps the most exciting is a dedicated greens roller for the courses.

With these new greens mowers, we move away from hydraulic equipment on all the greens. The remainder of the fleet is expected to arrive in December, By January 2024, Royal will have a full fleet of new primary equipment – this will be in time for when the season is in full swing and they are needed the most.



















As winter is fully set in and parts of Johannesburg was covered in an unusual white blanket of snow, what better way to snuggle up next to a warm cozy firepace with exception red wines from the Western Cape. Here are a few winter warmers to help you through those cold nights.

Idiom Sangiovese 2019, The Grapes were spourced from the Da Capo vineyard, Sir Lowry's Pass, Helderberg in Stellenbosch. It's an enticing and emotive wine. Modern elegant Stellenbosch Sangiovese and presents a tantalising nose and complex mouthfeel. Signature sweet and sour cherry flavours develop into riper, darker fruit notes accompanied with complex gravel, tomato leaf and cinnamon notes combine with savoury spices to enhance the sweet profile of this stunning and sour Sangiovese. A silky, well-balanced wine to treasure and enjoy. Perfectly pair with pork belly and fiorentina steak.

Holden Manz Visionaire 2017, Sourced from the Franshhoek area, winemaker Gerard Holden bring you a wine that offers a smooth elegant focused palate with midpalate ripeness and spicy supple finish. Red and black fruits dominate balanced with a graphite steeliness. The tannins are soft and refined and exquisitely round off the aromas of spice and fresh plum. Savoury, layered complexity with lots of finesse. The multiple components of Visionaire allow each to show off its own unique characters while combining to produce an experience greater than the parts – each varietal a celebrated soloist combining with the orchestra of the blend!



Elgin Vinters Elgin Noir Merlot 2018, Elgin Vintners is based in the unique, cool-climate Elgin Valley, located in close proximity to the cold Atlantic ocean. Elgin Valley is 500 – 900 m above sea-level and surrounded by the Kogelberg, Hottentots Holland and Groenland mountain ranges. Their 45 hectares of vineyards are established on previously aged apple orchards. The rich organic matter soils consist mainly of decomposed granite, sandstone and shale. Rich aromas of ripe mulberries and cherries interfused with mocha, forest leaves, sweet spice, and notes of vanilla. Juicy, soft ripen tannins with a tarty acidic backbone ensures for a pleasing complex, lingering palate with a textured finish.

All these wines are new add ons to the Old Oak Cellar, they offer exceptional qaulity and value.

We are one of the only professionally run apairy management programs in South Africa and hope to carry on well into the future with history still present and a new legacy in the making.

I would like to thank Chris Bentley for his Beelief in BeeLIEVE, Jerry and his incredible greenkeeping team, all the Royal staff and all our members who have taken an interest in the initiative. The future never looked so beeautiful.

Hello Honey! "Maximising the use of green spaces"



INTRODUCTION

Royal Johannesburg prides itself on leading with innovation and management practices that continually improve one of the largest green lungs in Joburg. Conservation and sustainability is a priority to us, for the past 24 months we have secured wild colonies, allowing bees to live in their most natural habitat without over crowding and creating a safe and secure place for them to thrive. By having a professionally run apiary management program, we are enhancing the environment while producing amazing honey for our food & beverage operation.



CHALLENGES

Some of the challenges we face today is urbanisation, deforestation, illicit practices, harmful diseases like varroa, vandalism, secure apiary sites and theft. The honey being produced at Royal Johannesburg is 100% natural, no sugar substitutes are given to the bees at any point of their life span thus showing the importance around professional bee management practices.

Bees are vital for food security and beehives are also an important element for urban gardens due to the pollination services they provide. The journey of a single frame starts with 2 million flowers, it takes an African honey bee 6 weeks to create less than a quarter of a teaspoon of honey in it's lifetime.



OPPORTUNITY


Bees play an important role in our everyday lives, many of the foods we consume and the products we purchase wouldn't exist if it wasn't for our flying friends (yes, that includes our beloved avocado's). When evaluating the general health of the environment scientists often use bee colony health as a benchmark.

The opportunity has been for our Club to create 6 apiaries in "out of play" areas surrounding the golf courses. The goal is to grow awareness around the importance of bees and developing our green-keeping staff while producing our very own honey. We plan to have twenty bee apiaries by 2025.

This enhanced flexibility translates into better clubhead speed, improved accuracy, and reduced risk of injury.



2. Improved Blood Flow and Muscle Activation: Engaging in dynamic exercises increases blood flow to the muscles, preparing them for the physical demands of the game. This heightened circulation delivers oxygen and nutrients to the muscles. which helps optimize to performance. Dynamic movements also activate the muscles that are involved in the golf swing, priming them for action and enhancing neuromuscular coordination.

3. Enhanced Warm-up of Specific Golf Muscles: A dynamic warm-up routine can target the specific muscles used in the golf swing. Exercises such as standing trunk rotations, shoulder rolls, and hip rotations help to activate the core, shoulder, and hip muscles, respectively. By focusing on these key muscle groups, you prepare them for the repetitive and explosive movements required during the swing, ultimately leading to a more powerful and efficient swing motion.

- 4. Injury Prevention: Golfers, like athletes in any sport, are susceptible to injuries if they don't adequately prepare their bodies. A dynamic warm-up routine helps to reduce the risk of common golf-related injuries, such as strains, sprains, and overuse injuries. By increasing flexibility, improving blood flow, and activating the muscles, you provide your body with the necessary preparation to handle the stresses of the game.
- 5. Mental Focus and Preparation: A dynamic warm-up routine not only prepares the body but also helps to focus the mind. By going through a series of active movements and stretches, you shift your attention away from distractions and focus it on the upcoming round. This mental preparation allows you to enter the course with a clear and focused mindset, enhancing your overall performance.

Snow at Royal JHB?

Luckily we could get most of the lesson in before it was way too cold for the 2 students all the way from KZN, to even hold onto their putters! Always a first for everything.....



Personal Calibration - the next step after taking the AimPoint Express lesson

Once the AimPoint Green Reading and matching Speed Control is mastered in the initial 2-hour session, it is advisable to go through the personal calibration. This takes into account finger thickness and arm length, as for each golfer it is different. I match the golfer's body to the patented calibration strip to become much more accurate on 3 to 10 foot putts (putts within 3 meters), to make a one putt. Each golfer receives their own personalised notes to refer to when putting. With practice we work towards perfection and increased self-confidence, which also has a huge mental advantage on the putting green.


