The month of August has been all about preparation, general maintenance and administration. We are looking forward to summer and the course team are finishing up the numerous projects, treatments and seasonal maintenance.

The first signs of spring are starting to show, with the trees beginning to develop new buds and this would be evident if you had played recently. At the time of writing this month's column, we have successfully completed our annual financial audit with HLB, for the year ending 30 June 2023 and our auditors continue to show satisfaction with the Club's accounting practices, good governance and standard operating The procedures. Annual Financial Statements will be presented at the 132nd Annual General Meeting (20 September 2023) and as always, the abridged results will be published in the Royal Review (10th edition).

2022/23 was another watershed year for 'Royal', as we experienced many highs and a few lows. The lows were a function of our external environment while the highs were made possible by the unsurpassed teamwork and execution of strength that has become synonymous with our Club. I am proud of what our Club has maintained, overcome, enhanced and accomplished, particularly in persistently volatile and complex environment.



It goes without saying that the year remained disruptive, heavily affected by country's ailing infrastructure. the administration and the economic downturn that confronts us all. The Club has not laid idle and among many preparations initiatives the implementation of our solar carport structure formally gets underway on 12 September. Once the energy structure is complete, it will take the Club 70-80% off the grid and stabilise the extreme fuel cost been inflicted. In conjunction, to curb the issues with COI billing, we will also be installing pre-paid metres.

Looking back at the financial year it was certainly abnormal and I cannot categorise it as one of great financial results, however the Club completed all its major projects and has shown great patience and fortitude to navigate the way, pivot and stay the course. The lows through the financial year equated to unbudgted fuel costs of -R1.5m while the highlights for the period saw our Capital Fund restored to R16.1m (R2.1m higher than forecast).


Following the conclusion of the '5 year' resolution and the annuity income from residents becoming a reality we realised membership growth from 1410 to 1654.

The notice of the 132nd Annual General Meeting has been distributed and this will followed by the Royal Review publication (annual reports) September 2023. I look forward to presenting my tenth annual report to the members and we encourage all to please attend the AGM and we ask the membership to please give special consideration to the Board members who will be standing down at this year's AGM and the Club will be looking for a new Treasurer, Club Captain and Lady Captain.

In line with the Club's rebrand, the Board will be launching the new Club ties and revealing a special portrait of the Iohannesburg Clubhouse (1900),commissioned and donated to the Club by R&A members, who are members of Royal Johannesburg. Lastly, as per the direction of the members, the Board will propose one special resolution being the final model, for the creation of a boutique lodge and function venue.

In closing, the Club is delighted to advise that our property developers (Tricolt) have once again confirmed their sponsorship of this year's Festival of Golf taking place from 23 - 28 October 2023. This is the fourth year running that Tim Kloeck and his team have undertaken the success of this exciting celebration and our sincere appreciation to them for all the support.

A cold snap, which is hopefully the last we will have, didn't affect the third round of the Interschools challenge with the Royal Family team coming out on top on the day. With one round to go, there are only a few points separating the top five teams, so there is everything to play for.

As we go full steam into spring and summer, we ask all players to be especially vigilant in course care around the grounds. The courses will start softening and greening up but also require a lot more care by both player and course staff. Repairing your pitch marks and filling your divots are paramount to the overall condition of our two wonderful tracks. Have you ever struck a tee shot beautifully and arrived at your ball in one of those pesky, yet well placed fairway bunkers, only to find your ball nestled in another player's dug out footmarks? This unfortunately cost me a buffalo to an unmentioned head pro lately. If we find the culprit who graciously left the bunker without raking it, a fine at prize-giving will be issued! Please ensure the course is left in a better condition than when you arrived.



We ask all members and their guests to always keep in mind their position on the course. Speed of play is always a hot topic in the game, and we ask all to always attempt to keep up with the fourball ahead. If you walk onto a tee box and the group ahead is on the green (on a par 4) you are out of place and need to speed up. In addition to this, we ask all members making bookings to adhere to our booking policy of cancellation at least 48 hours prior, to allow the golf department to fill the gaps wherever they may be, to ensure the best experience on the course. If you end up as a 2 ball in the middle of a field, you can only expect to have a painfully slow round. As much as the player assistants can push the field, there are situations that simply cannot be worked out.

FROM EAST TO WEST

The willows are blooming, so that means spring is now upon us. With that being said, the scarifying on both courses is complete, and next up is the hollow tining of the tees and fairways. This will start on the East course first on Monday 4 September and will be followed by the West course.

The scarifying is vital for preparing the courses for summer season and I am pleased to report that the scarifying process was a great success and already we can see new growth coming through. We have marked out new cutting lines on the West tees and have moved away from the squared tee and made them rounder. By doing this we can generate more teeing ground on the tee boxes without comprising vital space. Each tee will have a different appearance - some will be round while some will be bean shaped and I truly believe that this will add to the unique look and beauty of the West course.

Spring time at Royal is a time of balance for us. As we all know, we rely solely on storm water capture and water run off from the surrounding neighbourhood to fill our dams to use on the courses.



We are not fortunate enough to have a river from which we could get a constant supply of water to the courses, to put them into top condition early in summer. We balance our usage by the amount of water coming into our dams vs dams levels, along with evaporation rates. Although multiple warnings have been issued by the weather services of an El Nino presence, no real prediction is given in terms of rainfall expectations but what is certain is that we will be experiencing some early heat during the day. This is a stressful time for us, but learning from the past I believe we will head into this as well prepared as we can be. With that being said, we will only be fertilizing all the tees and fairways once the rains have arrived and we feel comfortable that we will have some consistent rainfall.

We are moving onto the second stage of leveling the tees on the West course. Although the tees are not fully recovered, they are usable and I am sure the members cannot wait to hit from their usual tees. Following the completion of the West course we will move across to the East course to start with the par 3 tees there.

The East course staff have been doing quite a bit of work in moving sand and rechecking all the levels in the bunkers. August is always a time when we experience a lot of sand movement during the hotter days due to the sand drying out much quicker than usual. Something that we do find a lot is consistently unraked bunkers and golfers exiting and entering the bunkers on the high side. Golfers need to leave the course in a better condition than what they find it.

We would like to thank the members for their understanding during the spring treatment period and as we near the end of the treatment, the members will realise the sacrifices made will be greatly rewarded.





What has been a mixed winter season with unexpected cold fronts, snow and rain causing major disturbances within the hives. Condensation played a major factor this winter season and I'm already trying to solve this issue for the 2024 winter season. I'm glad to announce that there are now officially 6 working hive colonies and all bee hive colonies made it through naturally.

The West course will be the area of attention for the 2023/2024 swarming season with empty catch boxes being placed behind the 15th green. Many golfers will encounter swarms on both courses which is common and the advise is to firstly stay calm, do not swat at the bees, walk in the opposite direction of the swarm as soon as possible - swarming bees are chasing their queen who has left her old existing colony in search of a new home and are the least dangerous when it comes to bee activity movements. You will also encounter male swarming, this is a grouping of smaller swarms but louder as the male bees chase down a virgin queen. Please report all bee swarm sightings to reception which will be noted down.

There are plans to remove the colony of bees in the propolis tree on hole three of the East championship course as well as the water valve box inside the garden bed alongside the 10th tee box, please still be extremely vigilant in these areas especially on windy days.

Prepping practice tees for summer




