



This will be followed by the much anticipated Club Championships which will be held on 16 & 17 March (entries are limited and open now) and promises to be bigger and better than ever before.


As communicated at year end, the Club is now establishing the next long term strategic plan, which will address some of the bigger challenges ahead, Primary of these is funding for areas such as the restoration of waterways and old dams, rebuilding/redesigning of old tee boxes and the implementation of more cart paths etc. There will also be further exciting enhancements to consider for the longer term, like night golf and much more. In the interim the Club continues and is progressing well with many smaller projects and enhancements, like the new car wash with Martha, an extension of landscapes and the rollout of new branding (signage).

As the Club's moniker 'The Royal Experience', underlines the great support of the members, which is amplified by the management and Board's drive to continually protect and enhance our Club. We have so much to look forward to in 2024.





In what is believed to be the biggest such project implemented, so far, at a major South African golf club, a solar power and battery microgrid has been commissioned at Royal Johannesburg. The project was the fruit of collaboration between the club, Solarise Africa, Hooray Power and Caracal Engineering. "Selecting Solarise Africa as our energy partner was a strategic decision driven by their expert approach, proven success, and innovative power purchase IPPAI model that relieved us of the capital burden associated with outright purchase and future technology requirements," explained golf club CEO Christopher Bentley. "With our solar system now operational, generating around 400 MWh of energy per year, we anticipate substantial savings on our monthly energy bills, coupled with the assurance of a constant energy supply. This venture not only secures our financial interests but also aligns seamlessly with our commitment to environmental sustainability."
















Representing South Africa!

TOURNAMENT SEASON HAS ARRIVED

Can't believe our summer season is heading into its final chapter already as it feels like yesterday that we started our spring treatments on the golf courses. We were blessed with great weather over the December period, allowing for optimum golfing conditions, with 114mm recorded for the month. Our annual rainfall was 400mm less in 2023 than in 2022. The El Nino presence was felt during spring and as predicted, the summer season would have above normal rain conditions - January has seen a total of 310mm. Both courses have held up above expectations during these wet conditions and fortunately rain occurred on a quieter period which allowed the courses to dry out with minimal traffic or damages. We have lost two tree's during these storms - one Pine Tree on the right hand side of 3 West which fell over, and then one tree on the right hand side of 4 East that got split in half by a lightning strike.



2024 is a packed year full of exciting new improvements on the courses and events coming to Royal - we cannot wait to get going on them.

Hollowtining of the East greens commenced on 8 January 2024, and recovery has been optimum, greens are back to full cover within three weeks, just in time for the SA Amateur starting 4 February 2024. Leading up to the event we will work hard on green speeds to ensure they have proper test of the East Championship course.


Our machinery fleet is also almost all delivered, with only the tee and fairway units still on their way and we expect them by end of March. These hybrid units have an outstanding performance in terms of quality of cut and being more fuel efficient then our current tee and fairway units. We eagerly await their arrival.

During February we don't have any major maintenance planned for the courses and the greens will only be lightly dusted following the SA Amateur to aid with recovery after the week. We will start with levelling of holes 2, 5, 16 East tee's during February to be ready for use come Club Champs.

Incase you missed it...

It is not just for the sake of the greens - there is nothing more infuriating for a golfer than to see a perfect putt knocked off line, especially through no fault of the player. It is essential that all players are diligent in their repair of pitch marks on greens. Please repair your pitch mark and any others you might find. We also remind all golfers that it is compulsory to either fill your divots with sand provided or by replacing the divot taken (if there is still soil attached). We need all golfers to get into the habit of repairing all pitchmarks and divots, even those which are not yours or your playing partners. It will help us get the best out of our playing surfaces for you!










So, if these points hold true, why do so many struggle with motivation for training, often abandoning their fitness endeavours, even when they acknowledge the benefits?





LET'S GET BEESY WITH ROYAL BEES


Welcome back to our incredible members and a big thank you to all staff who give usthis magnificent facility day in and day out, sunshine or in Gautengs case, some of thebiggest electrical storms faced during the 2023/2024 summer period. As expected, arguably the hardest time to work as a beekeeper because of the unpredictable summerfronts which have kept us from opening the hives but in return, given us beautifulblessings in constant rainfall during the summer period.

2024 is an exciting year for Royal bees and our members.

We are officially starting the year with eight colonies in hives with all eight colonies in their respected hives to be apart of 2024/2025 spring harvest compared to our firstyear which saw two colonies being able to produce honey due to conservationcommitments and harvesting honey only from established colonies of a year and older.

One colony unfortunately absconded from their hive due to a mighty pest called thewax moth. This is a problematic pest especially in the Gauteng region due to lesser fulldays of sun. The moth sneaks into the hive undetected and begins to lay larvae in thecells of the comb and once the larvae begin to eat through the comb structure, the hiveswill fall victim to the devastating nature and expansion of the moths. To be more proactive in dealing with this pest, a hive would have to be opened more often than normal which puts high levels of stress on the bees thus the ideal is always to allow the bees to decide whether they should fight or flight.

The bees eventually absconded the hive and moved off to begin a life worthy of their evolution. A major concern from an Environmental stance is Huddle Park which is showing high levels of rubbish accumulating along the fence of hole 2 of the east championshipcourse. Plastic is picked up daily which is being blown onto the championship course from that area of concern. A complaint will be submitted to the City of Johannesburg to investigate this matter for any potential Environmental risks and personal health risks for our members and guests visiting Royal Johannesburg pertaining to the Huddle Park dumping site. Areas of dumping can cause material waste such as plastics and cans to seep into the groundwater tables and have the potential to pollute Royal Johannesburg dams and water systems undetected. If you are interested in joining our beekeeper for a hive experience including assisting in working on a colony of bees in a magical evening on course - let the Royal marketing team know and let's make your Royal experience that much sweeter.








