

# GOLF RULE OF THE MONTH: ACCIDENTAL MOVEMENT OF A BALL ON THE PUTTING GREEN

#### Rule 13.1d – Ball Accidentally Moved on the Putting Green

Did you know? If your ball accidentally moves on the putting green, there's no need to panic — and no penalty in most situations!

Here's what you need to know:

If you accidentally move your ball or ball-marker while preparing for a stroke, reaching for it, or even brushing it with your hand or club — there's no penalty.

Simply replace the ball or marker back to its original spot, as close as you can estimate.

This also applies if your ball moves due to wind, rain, or gravity after you've already marked and replaced it. Again, no penalty — but it must be replaced.

o its original spot and play on.

#### Penalty applies if:

If the ball is moved deliberately (outside of marking or replacing it) or in a way not permitted by the rules, a penalty may still apply.

#### Example:

You're about to line up your putt, and your hand accidentally brushes the ball with your sleeve — it rolls a few inches. What do you do?

No penalty. Just replace the ball to its original spot and play on.

#### **Did You Know?**

Royal Johannesburg is one of only a handful of Clubs in South Africa to carry the prestigious "Royal" title, granted by King George V in 1931.

This distinction places the Club in elite company, alongside a select group of Royal-designated Clubs worldwide. The title reflects not just a rich history, but also a legacy of excellence in golf, tradition, and contribution to the game over generations.

Over the years, Royal Johannesburg has hosted numerous professional and amateur championships, and has welcomed legends of the game like Gary Player, Ernie Els, and Seve Ballesteros.

## ROYAL NATURE

The **Water Mongoose** (Atilax paludinosus), also known as the **Marsh Mongoose**, is a fascinating and elusive creature native to sub-Saharan Africa.

This medium-sized mongoose is well-adapted to semi-aquatic habitats, often found near rivers, streams, and wetlands.

Water mongooses have a dark reddishbrown to black fur with white and fawn-colored guard hairs. They are robust animals, with males measuring up to 51.38 cm in head-to-body length and females slightly smaller. Their feet have five digits with curved claws, ideal for digging and grabbing food. Primarily solitary and nocturnal, water mongooses are excellent swimmers and can dive for up to 15 seconds. They feed on aquatic prey such as crabs, prawns, fish, and frogs. Communication among water mongooses involves vocalizations, body postures, and scent-marking.





The entire maintenance team would like to welcome Paul Leishman as our new CEO. Paul is well respected in the industry and we are very fortunate to have Paul as our Chief. We wish Paul all the best in this new role and he is assured of our full commitment and support.

For some reason, it feels like our seasons have normalised in a blink of an eye. Normally our frost only arrives with small pockets by mid-June but this year, our first pockets were noticed early May. All the bottom holes on East were covered in frost on the 27 May. With that being said, we head into winter with multiple winter projects kicking off and on the cards. Winter is also the time of year when we send our staff on their annual leave with a staggered approach over the course of four months. The first guys have already taken their time returning on 2<sup>nd</sup> June with the next guys following.

We have had two major events at Royal. The first was Club Championships which was a successful event, although the course condition was not at the best we know we can deliver, due to the weather we have faced over the past three months. Congratulations to all who participated; you are all champions for showing up and supporting this event. The Sunshine Tour also visited us this past week with the Waterfall City Tournament of Champions. The course held up well with the frost threatening us on Thursday and managing to stay away. The feedback has been superb from players and congratulations to the Champion, Kieran Vincent on his fine play. We look forward to the next one.


Members will notice that we have started with the levelling of the 11<sup>th</sup> East tee boxes. We have used this opportunity to enlarge the three tier tee boxes and make them better aesthetically pleasing from the walk off the 10<sup>th</sup> green and adding huge value in the playability of this hole when standing on the tee. Following this tee we will target the middle tee on the 5<sup>th</sup> East. This tee box will also be enlarged by double the size. It is currently allowing for more rotation of the tee boxes and recovery time from divots. The West team has installed new drainage on the 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> fairways on the two problematic areas. We sourced the use of the excavator from the developer to remove the silt from the dam on 13 East. This dam plays a crucial role in our irrigation system and the silt build up was close to a point where if we did not clean it out, we would not have been able to get water to the pumpstation which would have resulted in a disaster, come the spring season.

On the maintenance side, we have the following happening in June:

- Vertidraining of the West greens with 6mm solid tine on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of June followed by a light dusting.
- Vertidraining of the East greens with a 6mm solid tine on the 9<sup>th</sup>
  of June followed by a light dusting.

Vertidraining (also called deep tine aeration), is a crucial turf maintenance process, especially on golf greens, to relieve compaction, improve drainage and promote healthy root growth. Vertidraining improves the soil structure allowing for oxygen exchange and water to infiltrate.

During June we will start with the mowing of all the veldgrass areas on East then followed by the West. the team will also get stuck into the wetlands on the  $6/7^{th}$  as well as the  $7/11^{th}$  to assist us during the rainy months to get the water off the courses quicker.





#### A buzz of strength

Working the winter buzz. with nature. June will mark three years since BeeLIEVE started this magical journey with Royal Johannesburg. Not only have we grown from strength to strength, Royal Johannesburg has become the benchmark and leader in Apiculture management for golf courses in South Africa, with many facilities starting to follow suit.



#### **The Winter Buzz**

As we prepare for the winter months, cutting has commencement on the east course and should take a few more days. We had plans to enter into a national honey competition but decided not to deplete the bees of their necessary food showcasing a true commitment to sustainable and ethical beekeeping.

To date, the hives at Royal Johannesburg have produced of honey and keeps growing every year. I hope we can carry on with this remarkable initiative into the future as the buzz keeps on growing.



#### Working with nature

Our pledge to protecting natural habitats through professional bee removal practices has seen trees still standing in their beauty while protecting the entire biodiversity chain. We recognize the urgent need to address environmental challenges such as climate change, pollution, and biodiversity loss.

Honey pulled off seven hives has totalled 148kg with an average per hive at 21.20kg

#### Power from the Ground Up: Unlocking Your Golf Swing with Ground Reaction Forces

When watching professional golfers, there's something unmistakably powerful about their swings. It's not just the fluidity or club speed—it's how they use the ground.

You might not see it, but every time a player loads into the backswing and transitions into impact, they're creating and applying ground reaction forces. This is one of the biggest performance differentiators in modern golf.

#### What Are Ground Reaction Forces?

In simple terms, ground reaction force is the energy your body pushes into the ground—and the equal and opposite force the ground pushes back with. Think of it like jumping: you push down, and the ground pushes you up. In golf, that same principle applies during the swing, especially in the downswing when force is translated into rotational power and clubhead speed.

The best players in the world have trained—consciously or not—to time and apply these forces efficiently. This creates torque, vertical thrust, and lateral pressure that adds serious distance without requiring more effort from the upper body.

#### Why It Matters for Your Game

Many amateurs rely too heavily on their arms and shoulders for power. This not only limits distance but increases strain and inconsistency. Developing your ability to push into the ground and "use the ground" during your swing leads to:

- Increased clubhead speed
- Better balance and stabilit
- Improved sequencing and timing
- Reduced injury risk

#### **Building Ground Force in the Gym**

The gym is where we build the engine behind this invisible power. You don't have to train like a sprinter or Olympic lifter—but you do need to train smartly. Here are a few of my go-to exercises to help golfers develop ground force potential:

#### • Trap Bar Deadlifts

A key move for developing vertical ground force and posterior chain strength (glutes, hamstrings, back). This builds the foundation for powerful vertical thrust in the golf swing.

#### Medicine Ball Rotational Slams

These mimic the rotational force and speed needed in a swing. Slamming into the ground teaches you to generate and release force explosively through your core and lower body.

#### • Split Squats or Lateral Lunges

These develop single-leg strength and lateral stability—essential for weight transfer and balance during the swing.

#### • Countermovement Jumps

A great drill to train the stretch-shortening cycle of your muscles (just like in your swing transition). Focus on landing softly to improve control.

#### • Band-Resisted Rotations

Attach a resistance band at waist height and perform explosive rotational moves. This teaches your body to initiate power from the hips and legs—not just the arms.

#### Final Thoughts

Using the ground properly isn't just for elite players. It's a skill that can be trained, refined, and integrated into every golfer's game—with the right approach. By pairing smart gym work with technical swing coaching, you'll be amazed at how much more efficient and powerful your swing can become.

And yes—it's measurable. Studies and 3D swing analyses show that players who improve their vertical ground reaction forces by just 10–15% can gain 3 to 7 mph in clubhead speed. That translates to 7–18 extra metres of carry distance, depending on launch conditions.


To put it in perspective:


- Tour pros generate vertical ground forces up to **1.6 to 2.0 times their body weight** at peak.
- Most amateurs are around **1.2 to 1.4 times** their body weight.
- Getting closer to tour-level force production—through targeted gym work and sequencing—can result in up to 15% more power output without swinging harder.

In one PGA Tour study, players in the top third for vertical force averaged **12 yards longer** than those in the bottom third—with no difference in body size.

So, using the ground better doesn't just look athletic—it plays longer. And the gym is where that begins.

Lower Body Power: The Hidden Key to Distance and Control in Golf

In the game of golf, distance and accuracy often steal the spotlight. Players chase more yards off the tee and strive for precision with every approach. While much attention is placed on swing mechanics, club technology, or upper body strength, one crucial factor tends to be overlooked—lower body power.



Your lower body forms the foundation of your swing. It plays a central role in generating clubhead speed, maintaining balance, and transferring force efficiently through the kinetic chain. The glutes, hamstrings, quads, and hips work together to create a stable base during the backswing and an explosive drive through impact. Without strong, powerful legs, a golfer is essentially swinging from a shaky platform.

In strength and conditioning for golf, improving lower body power isn't just about lifting heavier weights—it's about training for speed, control, and rotational force. Exercises like lateral bounds, jump squats, rotational medicine ball throws, and kettlebell swings simulate the demands of the golf swing, helping athletes generate ground reaction force and improve sequencing from the ground up.


But what happens when injury gets in the way?



By restoring mobility, rebuilding strength, and reintroducing powerbased movements in a controlled progression, injured golfers can not only return to play but often come back stronger and more stable than before.

Ultimately, lower body power is more than just a physical attribute—it's the hidden engine of both **distance and control**. Whether you're a weekend golfer or a low-handicap player, focusing on the strength, stability, and speed of your lower body can transform your performance. 
