


Each year the Club conducts an annual member survey, which ensures we continually monitor and track basic progress across the various Club topics, facilities, products and services.



March has been a busy period for the range. The driving range was well supported during Club Champs and it was great to see so many members warming up before play as well as preparing for Champs in the weeks leading up to it. Congratulations to Jacques van der Merwe who is a 'regular' at the range. Also well done to B division champion Clint Poppesquu - I don't think I have ever seen Clint hit so many practice ball before play, so that is obviously a winning formula.



Just a reminder we do have a Flightscope Mevo Plus for members to use at the range. The Flightscope is great for checking the distances of your irons. You can also use it to increase your driving distance as the device gives your launch angle, spin rate and clubhead speed. Working with the Flightscope along with Ricki or me, can help you understand these parameters and optimise them for maximum distance.

The Flightscope can also be used to practice pitching and the short game. The angle of attack of the clubhead is the magic parameter for the short game. The angle of attack should be between 9 and 12 degrees down for consistent contact in pitching. We can measure this and work on it with the Flightscope.

Here is Rory Crosley who works with me at the range with the Flightscope. Rory has been working on his distances. It's a great tool.

It is great to see so many members making use of the range and please remember if you need help with the game, you can contact Gavan, Ricki or me for a lesson.






ITS ALL COMING TOGETHER!

The first month of autumn has been a hot one indeed and although we felt the presence of a heatwave during the first three weeks, the courses held up greatly during this time. Club Champs weekend was a huge success and compliments to everyone involved as the atmosphere set out from the entrance made my job easier. Congratulations to our Club Champions and everyone who took part in this special member event - I am already looking forward to next year's Club Championship.

With Club Champs behind us, we have started our seven week count down to the Tournament of Champions to be held on the East course. During the next two weeks we will complete any repair works on the East course and focus on conditioning during the last five weeks. I believe this event will be a spectacular event as Royal will showcase at its prime during mid-autumn with our trees amplifying the course in every aspect.




The team has started working on a new garden bed behind the 4th East green as this is a dead, out of play area, where bark was placed for aesthetic reasons. The bark turned out to be a huge cost and when there were storms, the bark chips were washed onto the green. The new bed will amplify the backdrop of the green and also add value to the 5th tee. Agapanthus and Wild Iris will be primarily used as they are self-sustainable once established and we will border the front with beautiful colours to add to the greens back drop. We will also soon extend the garden on the left of the 10th East tee and sod out the service road caused by the staff.

No major maintenance is planned for April and our regular vertical mowing of tees and fairways will still happen on the course closure days and dusting of greens will take place, leading up to the Tournament to ensure we have a great playing surface. The West course greens will however receive a granular fertilizer in April to ensure that they will be well protected for winter and as part of our agronomic plan.

Pitch marks remain a huge burden on the courses and it is alarming to see the amount of unrepaired and mostly incorrectly repaired pitch marks daily. The West greens are suffering mostly, because they are still fairly new and will only getting denser after year two, which is in September 2024.


Pitch marks should not be lifted when repaired but pulled into the centre to be able to recover within a day. An unrepaired pitch mark can take several weeks to recover and in winter, several months!Please do your bit in looking after our courses!


I look forward to April and the transition from summer to autumn as the leaves start falling and changing as we all know.

















One of the questions I often get asked is what to do to warm the body up for golf. For the vast majority of club golfers, they don't have the luxury of arriving an hour before their tee time to go to the gym, warm up, go to the driving range to hit balls, drain a few putts on the putting green and then head to the first tee, brimming with confidence.

Most of us arrive with moments to spare, we check in at the pro shop and slap a few putts 10 feet past the hole on the putting green before running to the tee, only to double the first hole and wonder why our golf is so inconsistent.

This topic of a golf warm up has been covered before, but if members knew how effective a good golf warm up could be, the Royal Gym would be packed before every member's day!

The study revealed that the best way to warm up for golf involved a dynamic (movement-based) warm up with resistance (exercise bands). The average improvement in driver carry distance across the test group was 7 yards, with some individuals experiencing over 40 yard improvement in driver carry.

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
Now a warm up can look different for golfers of different fitness levels, so if your exercise tolerance is lower than most, a vigorous warm up can actually decrease driver club head speed and distance, as fatigue becomes a factor. So there is definitely an element of specificity needed to ensure the warm up is tailored to you, for the main purpose of preparing you for a round of golf.

Having said that, a 10-15 minute warm up routine is all you need to warm the body up, prime the neural pathways and increase blood flow to the muscles, all of which could help you gain those precious meters off the tee.


Pace Yourself: Avoid overexertion by pacing yourself during matches and training sessions. Allow time for rest and recovery between games to prevent fatigue-related injuries.


